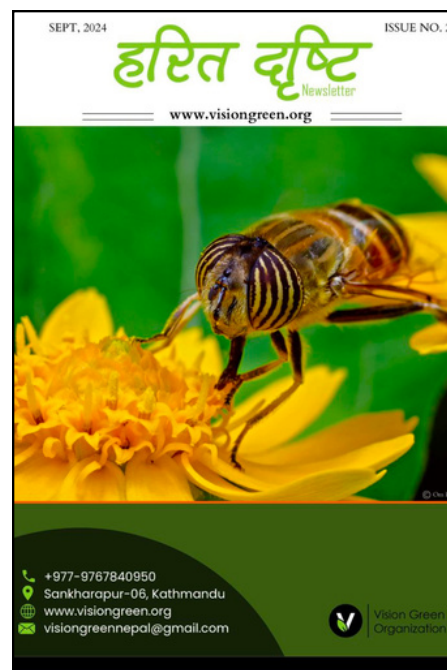
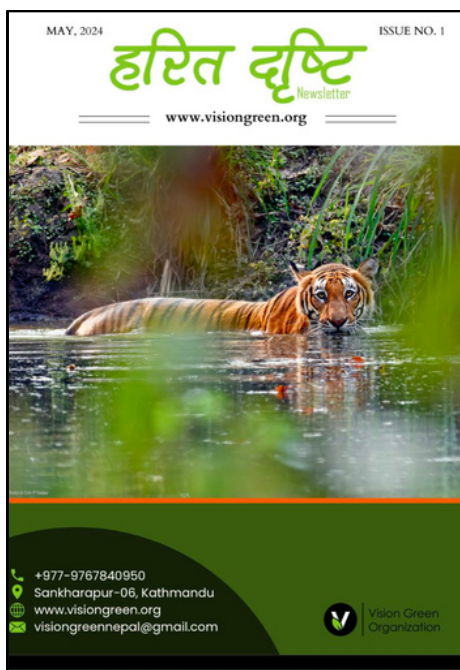




Harit Dristi Newsletter 2024

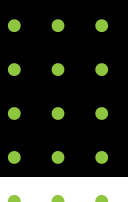

The Student Environmental Leadership Programme (SELP) aims to empower youth across Nepal—particularly from indigenous, marginalized, and rural communities—with environmental literacy, leadership skills, and tools for sustainable action. Through a 12-month virtual training and seed-grant initiative, SELP builds local capacity to address climate change, promote green entrepreneurship, preserve indigenous knowledge, and foster grassroots advocacy that aligns with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

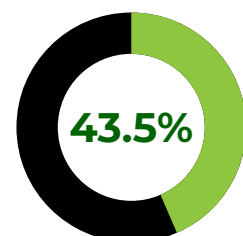
